#### January 23, 2016 Headlines

• Car Use Drops to 1950s Level

- Transit Agencies Close Gaps, are consolidated
- Rideshare
- Transit Packed, Cars Parked!
  - Free transit moves masses
  - Clean air fills lungs
- Love in the Carpool
- Bay Bridge Lower Deck Closure
  - Lower deck used for buses, bikes, walking
  - Number of vehicles down
- Bike/ped network interconnected and complete
  - "You can get there"
- High-speed rail arrives in the Bay Area
- Weekend road closures draw crowds!

#### **Brainstorming**

- Fund efforts: HOT lanes, park fees, CO2 tax
- Mandatory mitigations
  - VMT/CO2-related pricing for resources (e.g., water)
- Mandatory collection of car mileage data on registration form
- Standards for electric car charging
- Standards for hydrogen infrastructure
- Consolidate transit agencies to:
  - Improve connections
  - Timing
  - Ticketing
  - Convenience
  - Eliminate competition for funding
- Retrain staff engineers to analyze alternative models of transportation and complete streets, not just vehicle throughput

- Incentives to not drive
- Revenue sharing
- State/federal buy-in on local programs/policy (integrated)
  - Identify inconsistencies
  - Issue position papers
  - Lobbying
- Design guidelines for good transit-oriented development (TOD) and mixed-use development ("walkable")
- Area or statewide traffic/climate tax/fees
- Penalize auto trips

#### **Projects to Review**

- 1. Share legislative programs
  - a. CEQA streamlining
  - b. CMP (congestion management process)
  - c. Countywide transportation plan
- 2. Advocate for new funding
  - a. Prioritize
  - b. Collaborations/partnerships
  - c. Help define eligibility and performance measures
- 3. Advocate for coordinated policy
  - a. Regionally
  - b. Statewide
- 4. Adopt multimodal standards and add capability for project evaluation
  - a. Retrain staff engineers
    - i. new calculations: LOS (level of service) -> VMT (vehicle miles traveled)
  - b. Support OPR (Governor's Office of Planning and Research) guidelines
- 5. Best practice guidelines for TOD (build and operate)
  - a. Truck access
  - b. Shared parking
  - c. Transportation/ped
  - d. Electric car charging
  - e. Bike parking
- 6. Information technology to reduce trips
  - a. Web central site for government service info
  - b. Central telephone for govt services e.g., 311 in SF
  - c. County/city staff telecommuting keep people home
