- USGBC opens Demolition History Museum: Governor declares intent to deconstruct the boxes.
- <u>Green jobs update:</u> "StopWaste.Org funds retraining program for idle landfill workers"
- <u>Bay Area Food Section:</u> Alameda County and cities adopts universal biodegradable takeout fare ordinance
