






The County Is The Safety Net





Income Inequality Increases


Top 1% of Americans owned a greater share of household wealth in 2009 than bottom 90%



Top 1% of Californians earned 33x average of middle 20% -- almost 2x the disparity from 1987.




After Tax Income Growth 1980-2010






Income Inequality Comparison







Wealth/Poverty Ratio of Top 20% Incomes to Bottom 20% Incomes






Child Poverty in Alameda County








Long-Term Unemployment

- Alameda County: 38,444 dropped from unemployment benefits 2011-13




Employment: Labor Force Participation Rate






Employment: Historical Wages

Cost of Child Care in Alameda County

Monthly cost of child care = \$1,279

Less than half of 50,000 eligible Alameda County children receive subsidized ECE



Monthly income at \$9/hour = \$1,440

5,800 Alameda County children were on a waiting list when funding to maintain the waiting list was eliminated

Food Insecurity Growing

- 1 in 7 Americans rely on Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Federal Program doubled 2007 to 2013
- Food Insecurity in Alameda County
 - CalFresh usage up 120% since 2008
 - 40,000 people (15%)
 - 68,000 children (18%)
- □ ARRA provisions expired 11/13



- 129,000 people
- 63,000 children
- □ Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) tightened in Farm Bill & addressed in May Revise
 - 300,000 families in State,
 - 10,000 families in County
 - \$62/month or 30 meals




