




#### **2012-13 Alameda County Funding Sources**






# The County Is The Safety Net

#### **Program Appropriations**








### **And Human Impacts Reflect Budget**

Jobs	15,212,200	14,398,800
Unemployment Rate	5.4%	9.4%
Long Term Unemployment	82,600	657,000


### **Highlight on Female-Led Families**

- ☐ Single mothers, regardless of race, experience higher levels of poverty than other adults
- ☐ In 2010, the percentage of single mothers working dropped to its lowest level since 1996
- ☐ State funding for childcare at 15-year low, when adjusted for inflation
- ☐ Twice as many women as men have left community college



# Programs Designed To Help Female-Led Families Have Been Cut Hard Focus on CalWORKs

- ☐ CalWORKs grants cut by 12% since 2007-08
- ☐ Maximum annual grant in Alameda County for a family of three is \$7,656
- ☐ The <u>actual</u> maximum grant for a family of 3 was higher in 1989 (\$694) than today (\$638)
- The maximum eligibility rate is below the Federal Poverty Level










### **Poverty in California**


6.4 million people living in poverty is the highest amount in history




That total is **4 times** the number of people living in Alameda County




# Alameda County Poverty by Group






# Poverty in Alameda County by Location






### Poverty by Age in **Unincorporated Areas**
