



- \Rightarrow Time to tinker with the budget






State of the State Economy






After Tax Income Growth 1980-2010













Child Poverty in Alameda County



Poverty in Female-Led Alameda County Families



Comparison of maximum SSI/SSP grant to poverty (FPL) and to cost of studio apartment (\$1000)








Long-Term Unemployment

Decline in U.S. Wages, 2009-2012


